**Rector's Decision No. 4/2025,
issuing the rules governing the activities of the Study Programme Council
at Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice**

Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice (hereinafter the "University" or "UPJŠ"), in accordance with the provisions of Section 15(1)(b) of Act No. 131/2002 Coll. on Higher Education Institutions and on Amendments to Certain Acts, as amended (hereinafter the "HEI Act"), Act No. 269/2018 Coll. on Quality Assurance in Higher Education and on Amendments to Act No. 343/2015 Coll. on Public Procurement and on Amendments to Certain Acts, as amended (hereinafter the "Quality Assurance Act"), the internal regulation of UPJŠ regulating the internal system for assuring and verifying the quality of education, the quality of scientific research, development, artistic or other creative activities (hereinafter the "creative activities") and support activities at Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice (hereinafter "Internal Quality System" or "IQS"), and the Statute of the Board for Internal Quality Verification (hereinafter "IQV Board") at UPJŠ

hereby issues

the following decision issuing the rules governing the activities of the Study Programme Council at Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice (hereinafter the "Decision" or "Rules")

**Article 1
Recitals**

- 1) This Decision is part of the internal quality assurance system of higher education at UPJŠ in Košice in accordance with Section 15(1)(b) of the HEI Act.
- 2) The status and composition of the Study Programme Councils at UPJŠ in Košice are defined by Rector's Decision No. 2/2025, issuing the Rules for the Internal System for Assuring and Verifying the Quality of Education, Scientific, Research, Developmental, Artistic or Other Creative and Support Activities at Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice (hereinafter "RD 2/2025")¹.
- 3) This Decision regulates the activities and rules of procedure of the Study Programme Councils at UPJŠ in Košice.
- 4) For the purposes of this Decision, the term "faculty" also refers to a unit of UPJŠ that provides higher education but is not a faculty (hereinafter the "other unit"). In connection with the unit of UPJŠ that provides higher education but is not a faculty, the term "dean" also refers to the Rector, the Dean's Council also refers to the Rector's Council, the Academic Senate of the

faculty also refers to the Academic Senate of UPJŠ, and the Scientific Board of the faculty also refers to the Scientific Board of UPJŠ, or the Scientific Board of the faculty.

- 5) Person responsible for study programme (hereinafter “PRSP”) at UPJŠ and persons responsible for profile courses (hereinafter “PRPC”) at UPJŠ are responsible for delivery, development, and assurance of quality of study programme. Their role in the internal quality assurance system of higher education at UPJŠ is defined in internal regulations of UPJŠ, namely in RD 2/2025², Rector’s Decision No. 3/2025, issuing the Accreditation Regulations of UPJŠ in Košice³ (hereinafter “RD 3/2025”), and specified in Rector’s Decision No. 6/2025, issuing the Rules for Staffing the Study Programmes at Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice⁴ (hereinafter “RD 6/2025”).

Article 2

Meetings of the Study Programme Council

- 1) The activities of the Study Programme Council are governed by the agenda of individual meetings. Meetings of the Study Programme Council are generally open to the public.
- 2) Meetings of the Study Programme Council are held on dates set by the Chairperson, at least once a year. Meetings of the Study Programme Council may be held via videoconference or other information and communication technology without the physical presence of its members.
- 3) In justified cases, the Study Programme Council may invite additional experts or students who are not members of the Study Programme Council to attend its meeting.
- 4) The agenda of individual meetings of the Study Programme Council is prepared by the Chairperson in cooperation with the Vice-Chairperson. Members of the Study Programme Council may submit proposals to amend the agenda at the beginning of the meeting. Any amendment to the agenda must be approved by a simple majority of the members present.
- 5) Meetings of the Study Programme Council are chaired by the Chairperson and, in their absence, by the Vice-Chairperson. The Chairperson may delegate the chairing of the Study Programme Council meeting for certain agenda items to the Vice-Chairperson, even if the Chairperson is present at the meeting. In the case of a joint meeting of multiple Study Programme Councils, the PRSP may, after the consensus agreement of the members of the Study Programme Council, delegate the chairing of the meeting to the dean or vice-dean of the faculty.
- 6) Members of the Study Programme Council are required to attend its meetings. If, for serious reasons, a member is unable to attend the meeting, they are required to notify the Chairperson in due time and may deliver their opinion on individual agenda items to the Chairperson in writing (also via e-mail) prior to the meeting of the Study Programme Council.
- 7) Meetings of the Study Programme Council may be held if a simple majority of members of the Study Programme Council is present.
- 8) Members of the Study Programme Council submit comments, opinions, and proposals regarding the agenda items under discussion.
- 9) Minutes are taken of meetings of the Study Programme Council. In addition to formal particulars and the course of the discussion, the minutes include the decisions adopted on the items discussed. The specific opinions of students and employer representatives are recorded in the minutes. The minutes of the Study Programme Council meetings are kept

in AiS2.

Article 3

Preparation of an intention to establish a new study programme

- 1) The intention to establish a new study programme or the intention to submit an application for accreditation of a new study programme to the Slovak Accreditation Agency for Higher Education (hereinafter the “intention to establish a new study programme” and “SAAHE”) is prepared, upon authorisation by the dean/Rector, by the candidate for PRSP in cooperation with the candidates for PRPC of the study programme and submitted to the dean or Rector if the study programme is to be delivered at the University.
- 2) The intention to establish a new study programme (Annex 1⁵) under paragraph 1 of this Article contains:
 - a) the name of the study programme in Slovak and English,
 - b) the assignment of the study programme to a field of study or a combination of two fields of study from the system of the fields of study, or more than two fields of study from the system of the fields of study in the case of interdisciplinary studies,
 - c) degree of study,
 - d) the form of study and language(s) in which the study programme is to be delivered,
 - e) the standard length of study and the academic degree to be awarded,
 - f) graduate profile, justification of the societal need for the proposed study programme, and the expected employability of graduates of the new programme in the labour market, expected number of applicants and graduates,
 - g) definition of the focus of the study programme in relation to other study programmes delivered at UPJŠ,
 - h) the name and workplace of the candidate for PRSP of the study programme, including their research/art/teacher profiles (*in Slovak*: VUPCH) and characteristics of their creative activity outputs,
 - i) the names and workplaces of candidates for PRPC, i.e. the teachers who will teach the profile courses of the study programme, their research/art/teacher profiles and characteristics of their creative activity outputs in accordance with the rules for staffing study programmes,
 - j) the level of material, technical, and spatial resources available for the delivery of the new study programme in accordance with the conditions required by the programme,
 - k) the names and departments of candidates for members of the Study Programme Council.
- 4) The faculty/university management assesses whether the intention to establish a new study programme is in accordance with the long-term strategy of the faculty/University, particularly with the goals and objectives in the field of education.
- 5) The dean/Rector immediately submits the intention to establish a new study programme approved by the faculty management to the IQV Board for deliberation.
- 6) Upon approval of the intention to establish a new study programme by the IQV Board, the dean appoints the Study Programme Council, PRSP, and PRPC.
- 7) The Study Programme Council subsequently prepares a proposal for a new study programme as specified in Article 4 hereof.

Article 4

Preparation of a proposal for a new study programme

- 1) Following approval of the intention to establish a new study programme by the IQV Board, the Study Programme Council, under supervision of PRSP, prepares a proposal to establish a new study programme or a proposal to submit an application for accreditation of a new study programme to the Slovak Accreditation Agency for Higher Education (hereinafter the “proposal for a new study programme” and “SAAHE”) in accordance with the Accreditation Regulations of UPJŠ, the Standards for the Higher Education Internal Quality Assurance System (hereinafter the “Standards for Internal Quality System”), and the Standards for Study Programmes.
- 2) The proposal for a study programme (Annex 2⁶) usually contains:
 - a) evaluation of compliance with the SAAHE Standards for the Study Programme, the Internal Evaluation Report for the Study Programme (Annex 3⁷),
 - b) evaluation of the attractiveness of the study programme, graduate profile and employability; where relevant, the opinion of representatives of professional institutions,
 - c) evaluation of the national and international significance of the study programme,
 - d) evaluation of staffing, information resources, and quality of the educational infrastructure,
 - e) evaluation of the level of creative activities and their connection to educational activities within the study programme,
 - f) specification of the admission requirements,
 - g) specification of the conditions for successful completion of study,
 - h) the opinion of the scientific board of the faculty or university, if the study programme is not delivered at the faculty, on the proposal to accredit a new study programme.
- 3) The Chairperson of the Study Programme Council submits the proposal for a new study programme to the dean/Rector. The subsequent procedure for approving the proposal for a new study programme is regulated by the Accreditation Regulations of UPJŠ.

Article 5

Preparation of a proposal to modify a study programme

- 1) A modification of study programme means:
 - a) a change to the study programme that requires the addition or removal of compulsory courses or compulsory elective courses, a change in the conditions for successful completion of the programme, or an amendment to the course description for a compulsory course or compulsory elective course, excluding updates to the teaching staff, recommended literature, or the type, scope, and methods of educational activities;
 - b) a change to the person responsible for study programme (hereinafter “PRSP”) and persons responsible for profile courses (hereinafter “PRPC”) who demonstrate the creative activity outputs under Article 11 of RD 2/2025⁸;
 - c) a change to the study programme that creates the conditions for meeting the standards for the study programme within the scope of the agency’s decision to suspend the delivery of the study programme under Section 27 of the Quality Assurance Act.
- 2) Proposals to modify a study programme may be submitted to the Study Programme Council by a member of the academic community or a representative of employers in the Study Programme Council.
- 3) At its meeting, the Study Programme Council discusses the submitted proposals and

prepares an opinion on the proposal to modify a study programme. It records its opinion using a standard form in AiS2.

- 4) The Chairperson of the Study Programme Council submits the opinion of the Study Programme Council on the proposal to modify a study programme to the dean who then submits it to the IQV Board.
- 5) The further procedure for approving modifications of study programme is regulated by RD 3/2025⁹.

Article 6

Preparation of a proposal to cancel a study programme

- 1) The Study Programme Council prepares a proposal to cancel a study programme that the faculty will no longer deliver, in accordance with Section 51a(2) of the HEI Act.
- 2) The Chairperson of the Study Programme Council immediately submits a reasoned proposal to cancel a study programme to the dean.
- 3) In justified cases, the proposal to cancel a study programme may also be submitted by the dean/Rector or the IQV Board.
- 4) The proposal to cancel a study programme must include a proposal of settlement of uncompleted studies in the relevant study programme.

Article 7

Ongoing monitoring and periodic review of study programmes

- 1) The Study Programme Council continuously monitors, regularly reviews, and proposes modifications to the study programme to ensure that the study programme complies with the standards for the internal quality system and the standards for study programme, and that the achieved objectives and learning outcomes are in line with the needs of students, employers, and other stakeholders, reflect latest knowledge and the current state of its application, current technological capabilities, and that the level of graduates – particularly as evidenced by learning outcomes – is in line with the required level of the qualifications framework.
- 2) The Study Programme Council analyses and evaluates the quality of delivery of the study programme and prepares materials for periodic review of the study programme at intervals corresponding to its standard length of study:
 - a) academically oriented bachelor's study programmes,
 - b) professionally oriented bachelor's study programmes,
 - c) master's study programmes,
 - d) study programmes in the combined first and second levels of study every five years or every six years,
 - e) doctoral study programmes.
- 3) In ongoing monitoring and periodic review of study programmes, the Study Programme Council complies with RD 2/2025¹⁰ and RD 3/2025¹¹.

Expenses related to activities of the Study Programme Council

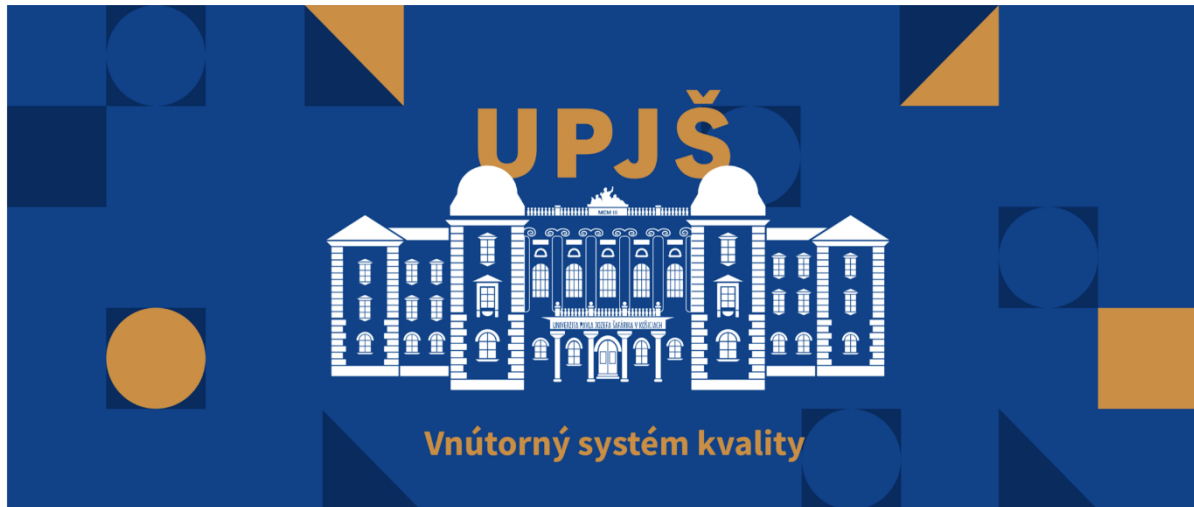
- 1) Members of the Study Programme Council are not entitled to reimbursement of personal expenses associated with membership and participation in the Study Programme Council.

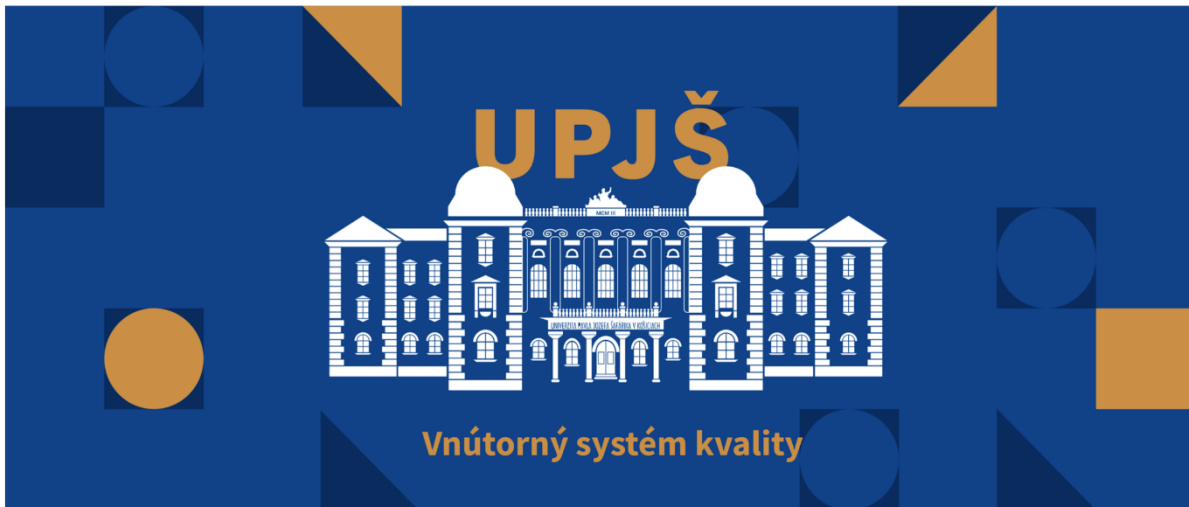

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SP 2.9.
