1. THE CITY OF KOŠICE

Košice, the metropolis of the East, is with its around 240 000 inhabitants the second largest city in Slovakia.

In the past, the city was a very important merchant centre, largely because of its ideal geographical location along the trade route between Budapest and the Polish territories, and its proximity to mining towns. It has always been an economic, cultural, and education centre.

On May 7th 1369, Košice was, as the first city in Europe, granted its own coat of arms, and we have been celebrating this event as Košice City Days since 1995. The city has a picturesque historical centre with many protected heritage buildings, various museums, galleries, theatres and cultural centres. Nowadays, the city is also an important industrial and IT centre of Slovakia.

The city is the seat of 3 public universities - Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice, Technical University of Košice and University of Veterinary Medicine and Pharmacy in Košice, 1 private higher education institution - University of Security Management in Košice and 3 faculties from other Slovak universities.

Košice was named the European Capital of Culture for 2013 (together with Marseilles), the European City of Sport for 2016, and held the IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship in 2011 and in 2019 (together with Bratislava).

DID YOU KNOW?

...that a non-official symbol of the city is a crow and the city inhabitants are nicknamed by other Slovaks as *Vraňare* (crow people)?

...that, since 1924, Košice holds the Košice Peace Marathon which is the oldest marathon in Europe and the second-oldest in the world (after the Boston Marathon)? It takes place on the first October Sunday, so if you come for the winter semester, you can participate :)

2. PAVOL JOZEF ŠAFÁRIK UNIVERSITY IN KOŠICE

Wisdom of the Past - Knowledge of the Present - Education of the Future

Proudly reporting to the old traditions of Universitas Cassoviensis, UPJŠ was established in 1959 as the second oldest classical university in Slovakia. The University is named after Pavol Jozef Šafárik, a 19th-century Slovak philologist, poet, teacher, ethnographer, historian and one of the first scientific Slavists.

Nowadays, UPJŠ ranks among the important and recognized educational and scientific institutions not just in the Slovak Republic but also in Europe.

UPJŠ provides education in three main cycles - bachelor's, master's, docto's and PhD. studies in different fields, and the process of education is provided in several study fields in both, Slovak and English language. It has five faculties – Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Science, Faculty of Law, Faculty of Public Administration and Faculty of Arts organized into institutes and departments, and also an Institute of Physical Education and Sport.

The key mission of UPJŠ is to provide higher education based on the newest scientific findings in a wide international context, following the European trends and goals laid down in the Bologna Declaration and other documents. UPJŠ co-operates intensively with academic institutions all around the world.

Study Results Assessment

The following grading scale is used at the university for the assessment of the study results:

- A excellent (excellent results) (numerical value 1),
- **B** very good (above-average results) (1.5),
- C good (average results) (2),
- **D** satisfactory (acceptable results) (2.5),
- **E** sufficient (results meet the minimum criteria) (3),
- **FX** failed (further work is required),
- **X** non-graded (did not pass, did not meet the required minimum criteria).

In selected subjects, credits may be awarded without an assessment grade. In these cases, the term "completed" shall be entered in the relevant records instead of a grade. The course is successfully completed if the student has obtained the rating from A to E or completed it. The student will only earn credits for the successfully completed study subject.

Botanical Garden

The Botanical Garden is a research and teaching unit of Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice, in a broader sense being an educational and cultural establishment of the region of East Slovakia of both national and international significance. Extending on an area of 30 hectares, with its greenhouses covering an area of 3,500 square metres and a collection of over 4,000 species, subspecies, and cultivars of plants, it is the largest botanic garden in Slovakia; plant communities in the area of the Botanic Garden are complemented by rare and endangered species of animals that have found their home here. It has the largest collection of cacti and cycads in Slovakia; very rare specimens of various tropical and subtropical plants, such as unique orchids, as well as "living fossils", such as wolemia, ginkgo or redwood.





3. YOUR MOBILITY AT UPJŠ IN KOŠICE

At UPJŠ the mobility programmes are managed either by the central International Relations Office (Erasmus+, Free Mover program), or by the international relations offices of the individual faculties (National Scholarship Programme of the Slovak Republic, Visegrad Fund, Ceepus, etc.).

While the application processes and the mobility documents may differ within the individual mobility schemes, the practical steps before, during, and after the mobility are essentially the same.

3.1 ERASMUS+ AT UPJŠ

Please, contact the International Relations Office at your home University and find out whether your university has an Inter-Institutional Agreement with UPJŠ, which is required for study stays and may be required for traineeships.

Nomination

After you were officially nominated by your home university, and the nomination has been approved by our university, you will receive a Letter of Acceptance and information on the application procedure and further steps.

Deadlines for nomination for study mobilites are:

- 15th May for the first semester and full academic year,
- 15th November for the second semester.

As an official nomination is not required, there are **no deadlines for traineeships**.

Application Procedure

We will need the following documents before your mobility:

- Learning Agreement, signed by both the sending and the receiving institution
- Language Certificate
- Photo of Yourself
- Other documents, if needed

KA171 participants must arrange a travel insurance covering the entire mobility duration, including days of travel.

Language Certificates are not required of English and/or Slovak native speakers.

Deadlines for applications for Erasmus+ mobility for studies:

- 15th June for the first semester and full academic year
- 30th November for the second semester

Do not forget to arrange your travel insurance.

Sign the financial agreement (KA171 participants)

We will need to sign a financial agreement and in order to do so, you will have to establish a Slovak bank account. For further information see our website: www.upjs.sk/en/information/international-relations/erasmus/ka171/



Register with the Foreign Police Office

In 10 or 3 days of your arrival depending on whether you are an EU citizen or not respectively, you should submit the Notice of the Stay at the local Foreign Police Office. More information is available here: www.upjs.sk/en/onepoint#entry-and-stay

Changes in the Learning Agreement

In the first month of your arrival, you are allowed to make changes to your Learning Agreement if approved by the coordinators at both the sending and the receiving institutions. Should the need arise, please, contact your home coordinator.

Extending the Mobility Duration

If approved by the coordinators at both the sending and the receiving institutions, it is possible to extend the duration of your mobility. The extension should be done at least a month before the planned end of your mobility. In case you are not an EU citizen, it is necessary to arrange the extension even earlier due to potential legal duties.

The End of Your Stay

After you finish your mobility and receive the evaluation from all the courses, we will send to you and to your home university the Transcript of Records and the Certificate of Attendance.

We kindly ask you to return all borrowed books and pay off any potential debts at the University Library and the student dormitory (if you stayed there).

KA171 participants will also receive a supplementary online report (second part of the EU Survey report) regarding the recognition of your studies at home and we would like to kindly ask you to submit it.

3.2 Academic Erasmus+ Coordinators

In order to provide full support for the Erasmus+ incoming students, UPJŠ had designated academic Erasmus+ coordinators at the individual faculties, institutes and departments, who will guide you through the process of course selection, schedule management, study requirements, and practical issues on the level of your chosen faculty.

Plane

The closest airport after Košice airport is Budapest airport. In orderd to get from Budapest to Košice you can either travel by coach bus (FlixBus), shuttle bus (e.g. Cassovia Express, Cassovia Transfer, IZIJet) or by train (from Budapest Keleti Train Station to Košice Train Station). The journey takes approximately 3 hours.

Train

Being one of the main transit hubs in Slovakia, there is a good train network in Košice with conections to most cities in the surrounding countries. All trains coming to Košice stop at the Košice Train Station. Tickets can be bought online: www.zssk.sk/en/

Bus

There are several bus companies covering intercity transport (e.g. Eurobus, FlixBus).

Zero-Fare Train Travel for Students

If you are a student (i.e. ISIC holder) and less then 26 years of age, you are entitled to free-ofcharge train travel in trains operated by Railway Company Slovakia. PhD students are not entitled to the discount regardless of age.

Other train companies may also offer discounted prices to students.

Transport in Košice

Košice is covered with a vast network of bus and tram public transport. First and second cycle students (i.e. ISIC holders) who are less then 26 years of age are entitled to discounted prices for tickets. PhD students are not entitled to the discount regardless of age.

Validity of tickets is bound by a certain time duration, during which they can be used for several vehicles. Tickets can be bought at some newspaper stands, supermarkets, ticket machines, or via phone apps (e.g. Ubian).

Please, note that to ride a motorbike you must be at least 18 years of age and a holder of AM driving licence.



Climate

In Slovakia, there are four seasons (Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter), each lasting three months. The Slovak climate lies between the temperate and continental climate zones resulting in warm summer and cold humid winters.

The weather differs from the mountainous northern regions (lower temperatures) to the plains in the south (higher temperatures).

The coldest month in Košice is January and the hottest month is July. However, in summer the temperatures can reach over 30°C on some days and drop below 15°C on other days; in winter, the temperatures are usually 0°C or slightly higher but can also drop below -10°C.

5. DISCOVER KOŠICE

HISTORICAL CITY CENTRE

Main Street ("Hlavná ulica")

A former medieval square, the Main Street is the real heart of the city. It will charm you with its pleasant and friendly atmosphere, beautiful monuments and colourful historical buildings. The whole street is a pedestrian zone where you can relax in its three parks, enjoy a drink or a meal in its various cafés, patisseries (yes, we love cakes and ice-creams :D), restaurants, bars and pubs or buy something nice in its boutiques.



St. Elisabeth's Cathedral



St. Elisabeth's Cathedral is the largest church in Slovakia (60m long and 36m wide). The construction works begun in 1378 and it took more than 100 years to build it. It was consecrated to St. Elisabeth of Hungary, patron of hospitals, homeless, nurses, young brides, widows, dying children, bakers and nowadays patron of the city of Košice. Both the interior and the exterior of the cathedral is simply magnificent, and if you climb the north - Sigismund's tower, you will be rewarded with a view of Košice from above. Legend says that one of the gargoyles on the roof of the cathedral represents an unflattering drunk caricature of the builder's wife, so everyone can see what kind of a woman she was - will you be able to find her? The visitors can visit also the underground crypt that hides the tomb of Francis II Rákóczi, the leader of an uprising against the Habsburg dynasty in the early 18th century.

Singing Fountain and Carillon

A square between the Košice State Theatre and the St. Elisabeth's Cathedral has a small park encircled by tall trees, ideal to relax and enjoy an ice cream :) At the centre of the park, you will find a singing fountain (the oldest in the former Czechoslovakia) that lights and sprays water synchronously with the music and a carillon with 22 bells (representing 22 city boroughs) that chimes every hour.







Košice State Theatre

Built in the late 19th century in the Eclectic style combining Neobaroque and Secession elements, Košice State Theatre is hosting different operas, theatre plays and ballets. It has a breathtaking interior with paintings from Shakespeare's tragedies on the ceiling.

Beggar's House

This charming house dated back to the 14th century, reconstructed in the 18th and finally in the late 19th century in Art-Nouveau style, is linked to another very well- known urban legend. The legend says that the house was built by a city beggar from his beggar alms. On the roof of the house, you can find a statue of a man taking off his hat, allegedly representing the beggar, who is greeting all who contributed to his house.



Crafts Lane (Hrnčiarska Street)

This romantic street, also known as the "Crafts Lane" is home to different crafts shops that are perfect for souvenir shopping and periodically host workshops for those who wish to learn a bit of their craft. You will find there different pubs too. At the corner of the street, near the Calvinist Church, you will find the flat of the former city executioner and Mikluš prison.

New Orthodox Synagogue (Puškinova Street)

This still active synagogue was built in the 1920s. At the entrance, you can find a memorial plaque in memory of 12,000 Košice's Jewish citizens who were sent to the concentration camps in the Second World War.





KOŠICE ZOO AND SUMMER TOBOGGAN RIDE

Košice Zoo is the largest zoological garden in Central Europe. It is home to more than 240 different animal species, the biggest aviary in Slovakia, and the largest brown bear enclosure in Central Europe. Part of the Zoo is a Dinopark. Close-by, visitors can enjoy a summer toboggan ride.

The Zoo is easily accessible from the city centre by taking the bus no. 29.
