1. THE CITY OF KOŠICE



- In the past, the city was a very important merchant centre, largely because of its ideal geographical location along the trade route between Budapest and the Polish territories, and its proximity to mining towns. It has always been an economic, cultural, and education centre.
- On May 7th 1369, Košice was, as the first city in Europe, granted its own coat of arms, and we have been celebrating this event as Košice City Days since 1995. The city has a picturesque historical centre with many protected heritage buildings, various museums, galleries, theatres and cultural centres. Nowadays, the city is also an important industrial and IT centre of Slovakia.
- The city is the seat of 3 public universities Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice, Technical University of Košice and University of Veterinary Medicine and Pharmacy in Košice, 1 private higher education institution University of Security Management in Košice and 3 faculties from other Slovak universities.
- Košice was named the European Capital of Culture for 2013 (together with Marseilles), the European City of Sport for 2016, and held the IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship in 2011 and in 2019 (together with Bratislava).

DID YOU KNOW?



...that a non-official symbol of the city is a crow and the city inhabitants are nicknamed by other Slovaks as Vraňare (crow people)?

...that, since 1924, Košice holds the Košice Peace Marathon which is the oldest marathon in Europe and the second-oldest in the world (after the Boston Marathon)? It takes place on the first October Sunday, so if you come for the winter semester, you can participate:)



2. PAVOL JOZEF ŠAFÁRIK UNIVERSITY IN KOŠICE

Wisdom of the Past – Knowledge of the Present – Education of the Future

Proudly reporting to the old traditions of Universitas Cassoviensis, Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice was established in 1959 as the second oldest classical University in Slovakia. The University is named after Pavol Jozef Šafárik, a 19th-century Slovak philologist, poet, teacher, ethnographer, historian and one of the first scientific Slavists.

Nowadays, Pavol Jozef Šafárik University ranks among the important and recognized educational and scientific institutions not just in the Slovak Republic but also in Europe.

The University provides education in three main cycles - bachelor's, master's, doctor's and PhD. studies in different fields, and the process of education is provided in several study fields in both, Slovak and English language. It has five faculties – Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Science, Faculty of Law, Faculty of Public Administration and Faculty of Arts organized into institutes and departments, and also an Institute of Physical Education and Sport.

The key mission of the University is to provide higher education based on the newest scientific findings in a wide international context, following the European trends and goals laid down in the Bologna Declaration and other documents. The University co-operates intensively with academic institutions all around the world.

2.2 Practical information

2.2.1 Organisation of the academic year

The academic year consists of two semesters: winter term (starts in mid-September) and summer term (starts in the 2nd week of February). There are two big university holiday breaks: winter holidays (Christmas period - 1st of January) and main holidays (July-August), and several other free days. Please check our <u>academic calendar</u> for the relevant academic year for more information.

2.2.2 Study Results Assessment

The following grading scale is used at the university for the assessment of the study results:

- A excellent (excellent results) (numerical value 1),
- B very good (above-average results) (1.5),
- C good (average results) (2),
- D satisfactory (acceptable results) (2.5),
- **E** sufficient (results meet the minimum criteria) (3),
- FX failed (further work is required),
- X non-graded (did not pass, did not meet the required minimum criteria).

In selected subjects, credits may be awarded without an assessment grade. In these cases, the term "completed" shall be entered in the relevant records instead of a grade. The course is successfully completed if the student has obtained the rating from A to E or completed it. The student will only earn credits for the successfully completed study subject.

Botanical Garden

The Botanical Garden (BG) is a research and teaching unit of Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice, in a broader sense being an educational and cultural establishment of the region of East Slovakia of both national and international significance. Extending on an area of 30 hectares, with its greenhouses covering an area of 3,500 square metres and a collection of over 4,000 species, subspecies, and cultivars of plants, it is the largest botanic garden in Slovakia; plant communities in the area of the Botanic Garden are complemented by rare and endangered species of animals that have found their home here. It has the largest collection of cacti and cycads in Slovakia; very rare specimens of various tropical and subtropical plants, such as unique orchids, as well as "living fossils", such as wolemia, ginkgo or redwood.



3. YOUR MOBILITY AT UPJŠ IN KOŠICE

At UPJŠ the mobility programmes are managed either by the central International Relations Office (<u>Erasmus+</u>, <u>Free Mover program</u>), or by the international relations offices of the individual faculties (<u>National Scholarship Programme</u>, <u>Visegrad Fund</u>, <u>Ceepus</u>, etc.).

While the application processes and the mobility documents may differ within the individual mobility schemes, the practical steps before, during, and after the mobility are essentially the same.

3.1 ERASMUS+ AT UPJŠ

In this chapter we will guide you through the procedure from the perspective of the Erasmus+ programme since the majority of the international mobility students visits us via this scheme.

3.1.1 Application procedure

BEFORE THE MOBILITY – the first steps:

NOMINATION

- 1. Contact the International Relations Office of your home University and find out whether your university has an Inter-Institutional Agreement with UPJŠ.
- 2 If you want to come for an Erasmus+ mobility for traineeships, an Erasmus+ inter-institutional agreement is not required, but some universities may need it, so please verify what rules are applied at your home university. For both Erasmus+ mobility for studies and traineeships, you have to pass the selection procedure at your
- For both Erasmus+ mobility for studies and traineeships, you have to pass the selection procedure at you home university and be officially nominated by your home university.
- Deadlines for nomination for study mobilites: 15th May for the winter semester and the whole academic year, 15th November for the summer semester. There are no deadlines for the nomination for Erasmus+ mobility for traineeships.
- As soon as your nomination is approved by our university, we will send you an acceptance letter and information about the application procedure and further steps.


APPLICATION

- We will need the following documents before your mobility:
- (Online) Learning Agreement for Studies or Learning Agreement for Traineeships part Before the Mobility. The Learning Agreement has to be signed by all parties before the beginning of your mobility. The Course Catalogue with the list of courses for the incoming students is regularly updated and sent to the students after their nomination.
- English Language Certificate or, if you do not have any, a Language Proficiency Form filled-in by your home coordinator. Please note that the required level of English (or Slovak) language knowledge of Erasmus students is B1/B2 (depending on the study field), according to CEFR.
- Photo of Yours
- an Accommodation Application Form (if you wish to be accommodated in a student dormitory)
- Other documents, if needed (for example students from non EU countries passport, residence card, proof of the financial coverage in English and in Slovak language).
- Incoming students visiting us within KA171 have to ensure travel insurance covering the entire duration of the mobility including the days of travel. An incoming mobile participant has to send a copy of the insurance to the IRO before the start of the mobility.
- If you have prepared all the necessary documents, which need to be uploaded, please fill in the <u>online application</u> form.
- **Deadlines for applications** for Erasmus+ mobility for studies: **15th June** for the winter semester and the whole academic year, **30th November** for the summer semester.
- Copies of all documents approved by our university will be sent to you or your home university.
- Please keep in touch with the International Relations Office regarding other steps before the mobility and please inform the IRO about the exact date of your arrival.
- Please do not forget to arrange your travel insurance.

3.1.2 After your arrival to Košice

- KA171 participants will also receive a supplementary online report (2nd part of the EU Survey report) regarding the recognition of your studies at home and we would like to kindly ask you to submit it.

3.2 Academic Erasmus+ Coordinators

In order to provide full support for the Erasmus+ incoming students, UPJŠ had designated <u>academic Erasmus+</u> <u>coordinators</u> at the individual faculties, institutes and departments, who will guide you through the process of course selection, schedule management, study requirements, and practical issues on the level of your chosen faculty.

3.3 Courses

The list of courses that are offered by our faculties for the incoming Erasmus+ students is available in our regularly updated. Apart from the regular specialised courses we also offer courses that are available for every study field:

- 1. our Slovak Language for Erasmus Students course is available for every incoming student (free of charge),
- 2. we also offer an Intercultural Communication course for those, who would like to learn more about other cultures, and improve their intercultural competences,
- 3. you can also choose from a variety of Certified International Interdisciplinary Courses
- 4. do you want to stay fit and socialize with other students? Our Institute of Physical Education and Sport offers for students of all faculties (including Erasmus students) various courses for credits during semester, as well as short-term winter and summer courses

3.4 Erasmus Student Network Košice

<u>The Erasmus Student Network Košice</u> is a volunteer international organization. Its members are the students of the Košice universities, who help incoming students during their mobilities, and organize various events and programmes for them during the academic year. ESN works for the benefits of all students taking part in an exchange programme, regardless of their origin. They provide a mentoring (buddy) system for you. International students, while in Košice, will have the possibility to attend various programmes, give lessons about their country, culture, and traditions, to create cultural awareness among the local students and fight stereotypes.

3.5 Erasmus Introductory Meetings

Our International Relations Office organizes Erasmus Introductory Meetings at the beginning of each semester for the incoming students. Your attendance on the meeting is highly recommended as we are discussing there all the necessary and key information that incoming students should know before the start of their mobility.

- The closest airport after Košice airport is Budapest airport. There are several shuttle bus companies that operate between Budapest airport and Košice, e.g. Cassovia Expres, Cassovia Transfer, Izijet, Airtrans, etc. (the journey takes around 3h30m) or there is also a direct train connection between Budapest city centre (from Keleti train station) and Košice city centre (the journey also takes around 3h30m).
- Other airports not so far from Košice are Bratislava airport, Krakow airport, and Vienna airport.

ZERO-FARE TRAINS AND STUDENT DISCOUNTS IN TRANSPORT SERVICES

Students under 26 years of age (both EU and non-EU citizens) can apply for zero fare transport services. If you wish to use zero-fare transport services, first you need to register at ZSSK ticket desks. More information is available at: https://www.zssk.sk/en/zero-fare/

Zero-fare transport services are valid only for trains operated by ZSSK, but students under 26 years of age with a valid ISIC card are entitled to other discounts in transport services depending on the rules of each transport company. If you wish to claim these discounts, please, verify the rules with the relevant transport company.

TRANSPORT IN KOŠICE

- Buses and trams in Košice are operated by the public transport company DPMK (Dopravný podnik mesta Košice): https://www.dpmk.sk/cestovanie/fares-excerpt-foreign-visitors
- Students under 26 who own a valid UPJŠ ISIC card can get a student discount price for the tickets (paper time tickets, time tickets purchased electronically from the ISIC card, prepaid time tickets 7/30/90 days) after having the activation done at the university terminals and after the activation done at DPMK.
- You can buy the tickets via SMS if you have a Slovak telephone number by sending an empty message to the 1166 number.
- Tickets are also sold at newspaper stands, automats, or via mobile applications, e.g. Hopin, Ubian.
- There are different taxi services in Košice. If you want to use their services, we recommend you to verify the price of your journey in advance, since different companies have different fares.

CLIMATE

In Slovakia, there are four seasons (Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter), each lasting three months. The Slovak climate lies between the temperate and continental climate zones, so we have relatively warm summers and cold and humid winters. The weather differs from the mountainous north (lower temperatures) to the plains in the south (higher temperatures).

In Košice, the coldest month is January, with an average temperature around -3°C and the hottest month is July, with an average temperature around 19°C. However, in summer the temperatures can rise to over 30°C on some days and drop below 15°C in other days; in winter, the temperatures are usually 0°C or slightly higher but can also drop below -10°C (and nights can be even colder).

Therefore, both warm clothes and light clothes will be useful to you during your mobility. Also, prepare for a little (sometimes more than a little :D) wind as well.




5. GET TO KNOW KOŠICE

5.1 Things to see in Košice

HISTORICAL CITY CENTRE

Main Street ("Hlavná ulica") A former medieval square, the Main Street is the real heart of the city. It will charm you with its pleasant and friendly atmosphere, beautiful monuments and colourful historical buildings. The whole street is a pedestrian zone where you can relax in its three parks, enjoy a drink or a meal in its various cafés, patisseries (yes, we love cakes and ice-creams:D), restaurants, bars and pubs or buy something nice in its boutiques.



St. Elisabeth's Cathedral

St. Elisabeth's Cathedral is the largest church in Slovakia (60m long and 36m wide). The construction works begun in 1378 and it took more than 100 years to build it. It was consecrated to St. Elisabeth of Hungary, patron of hospitals, homeless, nurses, young brides, widows, dying children, bakers and nowadays patron of the city of Košice. Both the interior and the exterior of the cathedral is simply magnificent, and if you climb the north - Sigismund's tower, you will be rewarded with a view of Košice from above. Legend says that one of the gargoyles on the roof of the cathedral represents an unflattering drunk caricature of the builder's wife, so everyone can see what kind of a

woman she was - will you be able to find her? The visitors can visit also the underground crypt that hides the tomb of Francis II Rákóczi, the leader of an uprising against the Habsburg dynasty in the early 18th century.

Singing Fountain and Carillon

A square between the Košice State Theatre and the St. Elisabeth's Cathedral has a small park encircled by tall trees, ideal to relax and enjoy an ice cream:) At the centre of the park, you will find a singing fountain (the oldest in the former Czechoslovakia) that lights and sprays water synchronously with the music and a carillon with 22 bells (representing 22 city boroughs) that chimes every hour.



5.1 Things to see in Košice



Košice State Theatre

Built in the late 19th century in the Eclectic style combining Neo-baroque and Secession elements, Košice State Theatre is hosting different operas, theatre plays and ballets. It has a breathtaking interior with paintings from Shakespeare's tragedies on the ceiling.


Beggar's House

This charming house dated back to the 14th century, reconstructed in the 18th and finally in the late 19th century in Art-Nouveau style, is linked to another very well-known urban legend. The legend says that the house was built by a city beggar from his beggar alms. On the roof of the house, you can find a statue of a man taking off his hat, allegedly representing the beggar, who is greeting all who contributed to his house, the statue is a merchamt.



Crafts Lane (Hrnčiarska Street)

This romantic street, also known as the "Crafts Lane" is home to different crafts shops that are perfect for souvenir shopping and periodically host workshops for those who wish to learn a bit of their craft. You will find there different pubs too. At the corner of the street, near the Calvinist Church, you will find the flat of the former city executioner and Mikluš prison.



This still active synagogue was built in the 1920s. At the entrance, you can find a memorial plaque in memory of 12,000 Košice's Jewish citizens who were sent to the concentration camps in the Second World War.



OUSIDE THE HISTORICAL CITY CENTRE



KOŠICE ZOO AND SUMMER TOBOGGAN RIDE (KAVEČANY)

With the area of 288ha, the Košice ZOO is the largest zoological garden in central Europe. It is home to more than 240 different animal species, has the biggest aviary in Slovakia, and the biggest areal of the brown bear in central Europe. In 2002, bear quintuplets were born in this ZOO and these five cute cubs earned a Guinness World Record There is also a Dinopark. In front of the ZOO, there is a summer toboggan ride ("bobová dráha") where visitors can enjoy a run downhill in a stainless steel slide. The ZOO is easily accessible by public transport (bus no.29).

Košice Gold Treasure, Rodoshto, Mikluš prison), Technical Museum, Museum of Aviation (at the airport), Underground Archaeological Museum, Museum in Nižná Myšľa (archaelogical and cultural museum near Košice), East Slovak

Gallery, Vojtech Löffler Museum, Sándor Márai Memorial Exhibition, Nostalgia Cassovia Oldtimer (vintage cars) and many other smaller galleries are waiting for you.



Košice State Theatre (main building and "Nová Scéna"), Puppet Theatre, Thália Színház Theatre (mainly in Hungarian language), Romathan Theater (Roma professional theatre) and other smaller theatres offer many interesting plays and programmes ofr their guests.



OTHER CULTURAL CENTRES:

Kunsthalle (former swimming pool), Kasárne Kulturpark and Steelpark (former army barracks), Tabačka Kulturfabrik (former tobacco factory), Amphitheatre, SPOTs ("výmenníky") offer various cultural events during the year.
